

EYFS Curriculum Map 2023- 2024

In EYFS we plan half termly topics in the form of open-ended questions. This gives us the flexibility to take the children's interests and questions into account when we ask them what they want to find out. For example, with "What's in an egg?" children may decide to learn about birds, dragons, reptiles, dinosaurs...even though we have some ideas and key texts for stimuli. If a class are really enjoying a topic and getting lots of new learning from it, we can stay on a topic for longer or move onto the next one quicker if we need to.
